Rich moved to Quail Creek with his wife, Linda, in 2017 from Grass Valley, California. His career spanned 35 years in the commercial property-casualty insurance industry with Fortune 500 insurance companies, including 16 corporate relocations to California, Arizona, Colorado, Utah, Connecticut and Michigan. He managed the northern California operations of the Hartford Insurance Group prior to retiring in 2006. Following retirement, Rich served as Nevada County Chairman of the California Republican Party, as a delegate to the state Republican Party for 8 years, and was elected in 2016 from the 1st Congressional District to sit on the California Republican Party Platform Committee.

Republican Party History - March

165 Years Ago (March 24, 1854)

The Republican Party was the result of a movement against the Kansas-Nebraska Act, which extended slavery further across the United States. The first meeting against this Act, and where the term 'Republican' was suggested as the name for the new party, was conducted at the Little White Schoolhouse in Ripon, Wisconsin, on March 20, 1854. From thereon the Republican Party rapidly rose on the back of its anti-slavery position.

158 Years Ago (March 4, 1961)

Abraham Lincoln elected as the first Republican President.
